


Mahika Parmar (Ruby House Captain); Ruby House



I would like to extend my gratitude our beloved school staff, facilitators and peers who helped shape my personality, the way I am.






Kailash (Performing Arts Prefect - Boy); Sapphire House

Aishani Mohanty (Sapphire House Prefect); Sapphire House










Sahil Agarwal (Cultural Prefect); Topaz House

Manasvi Kanaparthy (Literary Secretary); Ruby House





















































LAB MEMOIR




15 YEARS OF SCHOOL JOURNEY
