



MESSAGE FROM HEAD BOY







SHRUTI NARALA- PERFORMING ARTS SECRETARY




SRI SHREYA KURRA - STUDENT COUNSELLOR




AKSHAT SHARMA - EMERALD HOUSE CAPTAIN

TWISHA RAO- EMERALD HOUSE CAPTAIN



ADITYA JOSHI - SAPPHIRE HOUSE PREFECT



The eventful evening came to an end after the student council organized and conducted a series of games for all the teachers, taking them down memory lane and bringing the event to a close.






























15 YEARS @ DPS HYDERABAD
