Visit to Sai Old Age Home



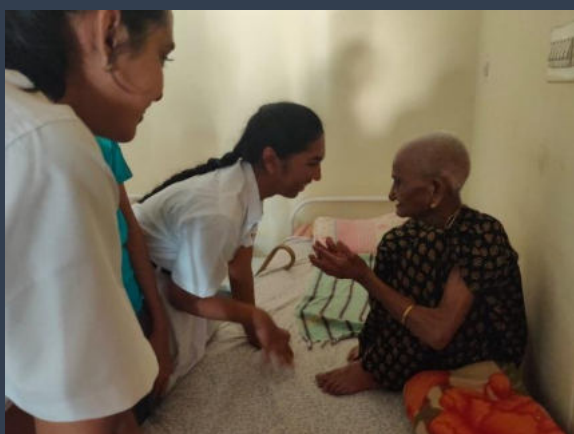
